

Lifting the downtrodden

Clarkston, GA, a city just outside Atlanta, is home to some 10-20 thousand refugees. TIME magazine called Clarkston the most diverse square mile in America due to the massive influx of refugees from 70 countries speaking over 90 languages.

Friends are crucial in helping refugees acclimate to their new lives. Our volunteers meet refugee families in their apartments and build friendships. Once trust is established, our volunteers take families outside the resettlement area to parks, museums, libraries, churches and cultural events. By taking them away from the isolation and exposing them to life outside Clarkston, they gain understanding of the opportunities open to them, and what it means to have a better life in America.

Refugees displaced from their homeland due to wars, political conflicts, religious persecution and ethnic cleansings. On average, families dwell in refugee camps for 10 – 12 years, typically in countries other than their own until given safe passage to countries that grant them permanent residency status. Within the past 28 years, United States has resettled 3 million refugees throughout the country. Sadly, refugee children often lack necessities, including proper education, nutrition, medical and dental care.

Education is the key to self-sufficiency. It is difficult for the public school system to meet the educational needs of these marginalized people who arrive with limited education and little English proficiency. Education is the greatest barrier preventing them from achieving success. Financial means is their greatest barrier to quality education.

Empowerment is one of the key components to strengthening refugee families. The atrocities, destruction and death that these families witnessed have left many scars and feelings of discouragement. Consequently refugees are in need of friends, guidance, education and assistance to access medical and dental care...the basic tools necessary for rebuilding their lives.

To address the education challenge, F.R.E.E. provides in-home English as a Second Language (ESL) classes for adults, and one-on-one tutoring for students. A primary focus of our organization is to give refugee students the opportunity to attend "refugee friendly" private schools. With the support of Aretescholars.org and generous donors, F.R.E.E. has sponsored many refugee students to attend private schools. Our goal is to help them attain a higher level of academic achievement and become positive / productive contributors to society.
